

The Southern Fire Exchange (SFE) is a regional program for fire science delivery, funded by the Joint Fire Science Program (JFSP). The SFE covers eleven states in the South and is a member of the JFSP fire science exchange network.







To increase the availability and application of fire science information for natural resource management and to serve as a conduit for fire managers to share new research needs with the research community.

### **3. PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT**

Fire research results and summaries are disseminated to end users through the bimonthly Fire Lines newsletter, fact sheets, and presentations available on our website and through Prescribed Fire Council meetings, workshops, and webinars.

The SFE is comprised of southern fire managers, scientists, administrators, extension specialists, landowners, and educators. The consortium is led by the University of Florida, North Carolina State University, Tall Timbers Research Station, and the US Forest Service Interface South.

A Steering Committee and Advisory Board representing more than 20 different organizations or agencies provide leadership, strategic direction, and approval for SFE activities and priorities.

Working with partners throughout the South, the SFE coordinates and assists with webinars, workshops, and field days to bring researchers and fire managers together to expand fire science applications on the ground.


